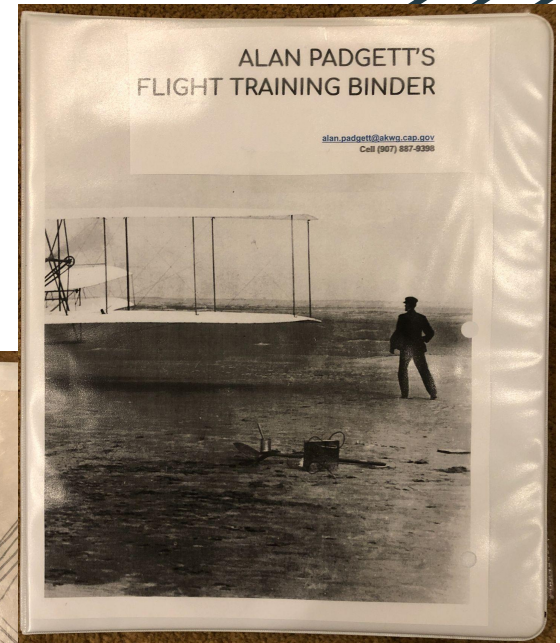
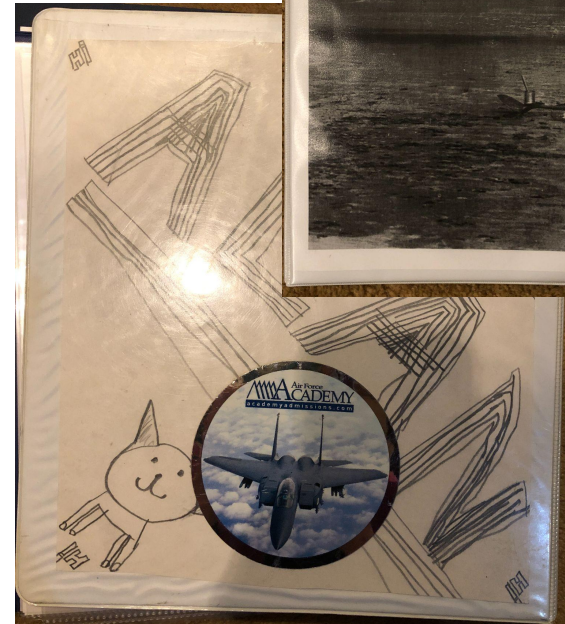
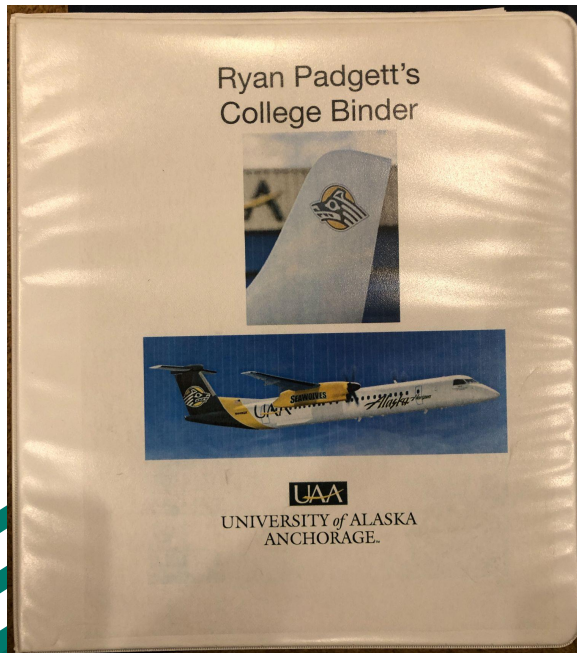


Personalized Covers

Cadets are encouraged to decorate the covers of their binders to inspire themselves to keep up the hard work and persistence required to obtain a PPC.



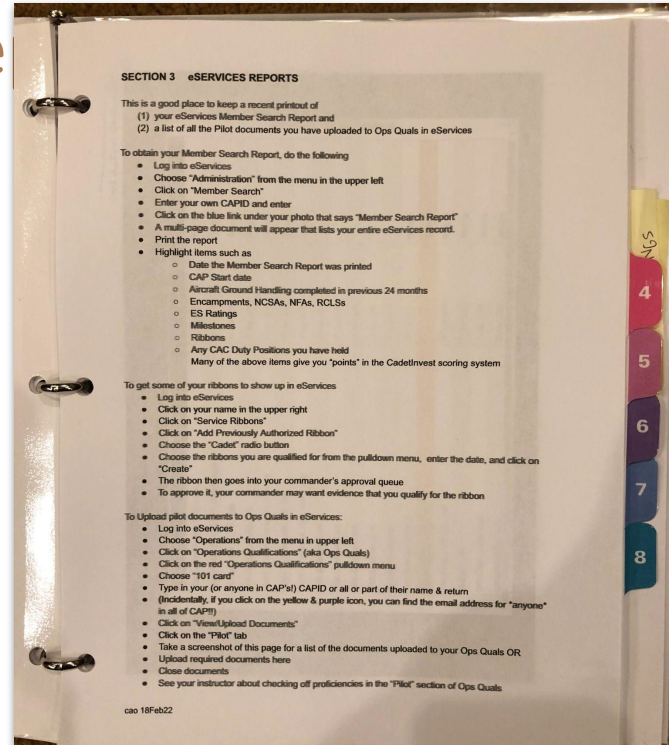

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Sect 5: Scholarships

- Students can gather information about the various scholarships available in the aviation world.
- The student can tailor this section to their specific demographics (home state, gender, age, skill level, etc)
- Cadets are directed to CadetInvest for access to many aviation and academic scholarships
- Cadet Wings is included separately in Sect 6



Sect 6: Cadet Wings Scholarship

- Funding for up to 60 hr of flight instruction (ideally to PPC)
- Valued at \$9000-\$15,000
- More importantly: Higher likelihood of *getting* to PPC!
- Applicants must gather 10-15 documents from various sources then upload and/or submit them in various places at various times
- Printout of the Cadet Wings Student Guide for easy reference/markup

SECTION 7 FLIGHT TRAINING PROGRESSION PLAN

The best way to get anywhere is to determine what path you are going to take. Use this section of the binder to plan out all the steps you need to take to get your PPC. Cadet Wings requires applicants to provide what they call a "flight plan" (not to be confused with the kind of flight plan you file with flight services before you fly somewhere). If you are applying for a Cadet Wings scholarship, or you have received a Cadet Wings scholarship and have to upload a revised "flight plan," carefully follow the instructions in Section 3.3 of CAPP 60-43 Cadet Wings Student Guide.

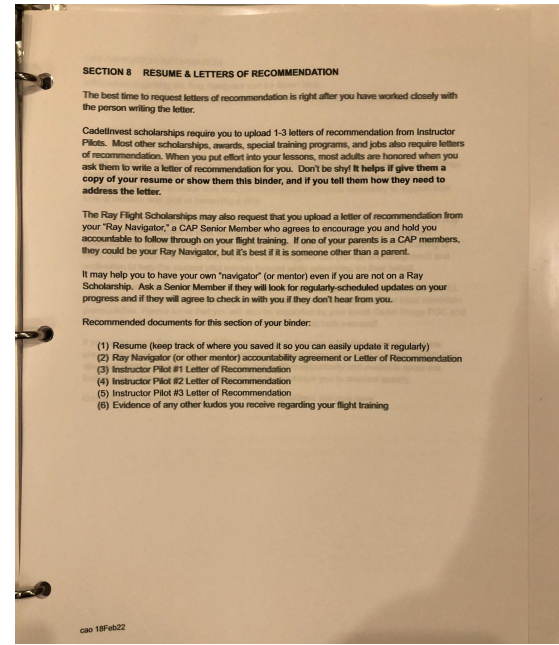
When planning and scheduling the steps you will take to PPC, consider the following guidance, taken in part from CAPP 60-43.

- a) 14 CFR Part 61 outlines the minimum total hours required for ASEL, gliders, and balloon ratings. Review those to structure your plan.
- b) A good rule of thumb is, for each hour you will fly, set aside 3 hours on your schedule. Add in study/chair-flying time.
- c) You should place priority on consistency of flying, sometimes referred to as keeping your hands warm. Flying every other day or at least 2 to 3 times per week is better than flying all day Saturday.

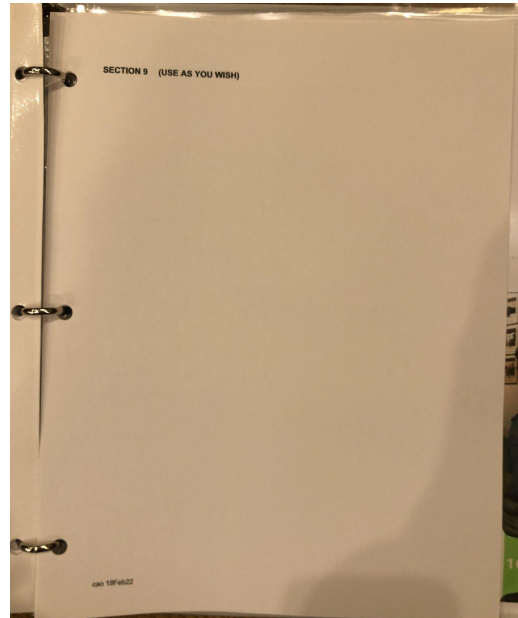
Sect. 8: Resume and Letters of Recommendation

When is it easier to get a Letter of Recommendation from your Instructor Pilot?

- (a) When you have just spent several hours with your instructor to whom you have just provided a format and description of the scholarship requirements and respectfully suggested a due date.
- (b) Months later when your instructor does not remember who you are.
- (c) The day before your scholarship application is due.
- (d) Hope they'll guess you need one and just hand you one out of the blue.

Your school transcript, highlighting

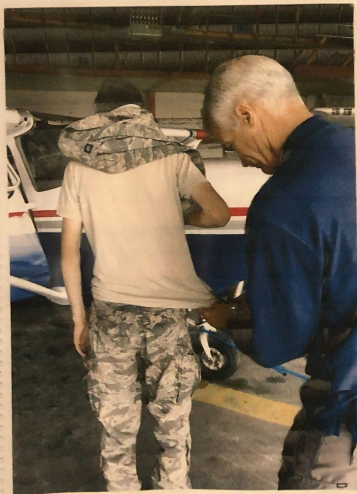

- AP, IB, and college classes

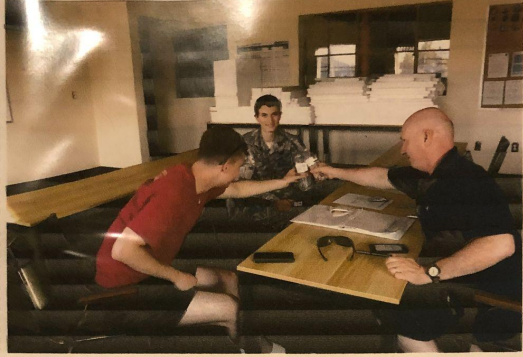
Your SAT/ACT Scores
