#### (Winter Raptor Encampment Code of Conduct if differs from below)

- The safety of our members is paramount and will not be compromised.
- The CAP Core Values will be honored at all times.
- The Chain of Command must be observed and respected, except for matters of safety.

Though a volunteer organization, Civil Air Patrol is similar to a workplace. This training prepares you well for the workplace as well as for CAP.







### What is harassment?

- bullying
- treating others in abusive ways
- making sexual or other offensive jokes, comments, or gestures
- making or spreading rumors
- any repeated unwelcome acts
- 3 types: Verbal, Written/Visual & Physical





### Verbal Harassment

- name-calling
- obscene or explicit jokes
- comments about anyone's bodies
- demanding one individual out of the group do something
- innuendo about behavior that is threatening
- attempting to persuade you to do something for them







### Written and Visual Harassment

Written: letters, notes, posts on social media or texts depicting inappropriate behavior or bullying others

#### Visual:

- making inappropriate or rude drawings
- taking inappropriate photos of others
- staring or leering at someone
- Posting ANY or all on social media.







## Physical Harassment

All unwanted physical contact—that of a sexual nature, that meant for harm, and any repeated unwanted physical contact.

ALSO...

Blocking someone or cornering someone in a space also falls under the physical harassment category.





## **Activities**

- Benefit of the doubt
- What if your friend is the person on the left?
- What if your friend is the person on the right?
- What if you're the person on the right?
- What if you're the person on the left?







### What if you see someone harass someone else?

- Stop the situation if you can stay safe
  - Confront the person,
  - Distract the person, or
  - Get a Senior Member
  - Write down what happened (WWWWWH)

 Cadet Staff: If something is reported to you, write it down and tell Senior Members



#### IF YOU SEE SOMETHING SAY SOMETHING



### What if you are harassed?

- Tell the person to stop
- Tell a Senior Member immediately
- Write down as many specifics as possible as soon as you can (WWWWWH)
- If it's online, take screen shots, then block the person. Do not reply!
- Be brave! Report the inappropriate behaviour. It's not your fault
- Stopping someone means they are less likely to harass someone else

NOTE: in CAP, complaints are handled privately, and you won't necessarily know about any adverse action





## What if someone asks \*you\* to stop?

- Check your regs/POD before you correct someone
- Remember that nearly everything is cadet-planned and cadet-lead. You may be undoing many cadets' hard work
- Cadets remember and are part of future selection processes NATIONWIDE
- Make a note in your journal in case there is a misunderstanding & you need to explain yourself later
- Senior Members are standing by to help
